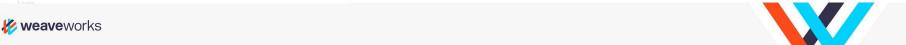
1. Fluentd is awesome

- Plugins for everything

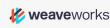


2. There are 2 versions 3 versions

There was also Fluentd 0.14, where many small details were different.

Now the latest version is 1.1, and it is based off 0.14.

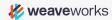

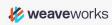
