Action	 Participation is critical to the Kubernetes
Required	project and has a firm due date Ex. Code freeze is at \$date, get your code in!
Priority	 Critical information to productive participation and community sustainability Ex. Changes in workflows, issue triaging, etc
Feedback	 When participation is helpful, but not required
Appreciated	by everyone to be a success Ex. Kubernetes Enhancement Proposals (KEPs)



Intro to Windows Containers & Kubernetes
